

# OUR HISTORY

For thirty years, Mainly Mozart has been a mission-driven organization with one guiding inspiration: Mozart. His music, his mastery, and all that he embodied as a multi-faceted man inspires our mission and vision—and is what sets us apart. Mozart personifies much more than classical music. He exemplifies prodigy, composer, genius, innovator, collaborator—and Mainly Mozart is driven to express these qualities in everything we produce.

In 2013, Mainly Mozart merged with the San Diego Young Artists Symphony to introduce the Mainly Mozart Youth Orchestra. Today the Mainly Mozart Youth Orchestra offers six different ensembles: Suzuki Strings, Beginning Strings, Intermediate Strings, Concert Band, Intermediate Orchestra, and Advanced Orchestra. Under a strong inclusion policy that integrates young musicians of all abilities and musical backgrounds, we provide students with solo, chamber, and orchestral performance opportunities throughout San Diego and Baja California, as well as the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to rehearse and perform side-by-side with the Mainly Mozart Festival Orchestra, composed of incredible principal players and concertmasters from major orchestras across the country.

Our ensembles currently serve over 200 students ages 3-23, hailing from all over San Diego County and even traveling from Los Angeles County and Baja California. Mainly Mozart Youth Orchestra students regularly participate in regional and national music programs such as NYO-USA, Tanglewood, National Symphony Orchestra Summer Music Institute, Idyllwild and more, and many alumni have gone on to pursue college careers in music.

# **MMYO STRING ENSEMBLES**

## SUZUKI STRINGS

Instructor: Jane Frey, Associate Music Director

Suzuki Strings provides group instruction for beginning violin, viola, and cello students from the age of 3. Suzuki students and parents receive individual instruction and daily practice assignments. Suzuki Strings performs each year at the Del Mar Fair on Bluegrass Day, at a San Diego County retirement community, and twice yearly in the MMYO All-Ensemble concerts..

## **BEGINNING STRINGS**

Instructor: Jane Frey, Associate Music Director

A Level 1 string ensemble, Beginning Strings students are taught basic notes and rhythms in both simple and compound meter. Students should have some prior experience on their instrument, and be able to play the assigned octave scales as indicated on the Audition Requirements page of MMYO.ORG. Beginning Strings performs each year at the Del Mar Fair on Bluegrass Day, at a San Diego County retirement community, and twice yearly in the MMYO All-Ensemble concerts. Students are required to study with a private teacher.

## INTERMEDIATE STRINGS

Instructor: Robyn Glasson

A Level 2 - Level 3 string ensemble, Intermediate Strings students are exposed to repertoire with increasing rhythmic and musical difficulty. Students must be able to play two octave major and minor scales, and orchestral excerpts as indicated on the Audition Requirements page of MMYO.ORG. Intermediate Strings performs twice yearly in the MMYO All-Ensemble concerts, and at various outreach events throughout the season. Students are required to study with a private instructor.

# **MMYO BAND & ORCHESTRAS**

## **CONCERT BAND**

Instructor: Frank Glasson

An intermediate level brass, woodwind, and percussion ensemble, Concert Band students are expected to have 2-3 years of experience with their instrument. Concert Band performs twice yearly in the MMYO All-Ensemble concerts, as well as at various outreach events throughout the season. Students are required to study with a private teacher.

## INTERMEDIATE ORCHESTRA

Instructor: Hernan Constantino, Music Director

A Level 3.5 - Level 5 full orchestra, Intermediate Orchestra students play arrangements and standard orchestral repertoire of both strings only and full orchestral complement. Students must demonstrate proficiency on their instrument in the form of two and three octave major and minor scales, as well as orchestral excerpts in order to be accepted. Intermediate Orchestra performs at both All-Ensemble concerts and at various outreach events throughout the year. Students are required to study with a private teacher.

Note: All winds, brass, and percussion students in IO are REQUIRED also to play in Concert Band.

### **ADVANCED ORCHESTRA**

Instructor: Hernan Constantino, Music Director

A Level 6 and up full orchestra, Advanced Orchestra students perform standard orchestral repertoire of both strings only and full orchestral complement. Audition requirements include three octave major and minor scales and standard orchestral excerpts. Advanced Orchestra students play at a number of events throughout the year, including both All-Ensemble concerts, various outreach events, and small chamber ensemble events. Students are required to study with a private teacher.

# **MMYO INSTRUCTORS**

## **Hernan Constantino**

Music Director and Instructor
Intermediate Orchestra/Advanced Orchestra



Mr. Constantino is in his 6th season with the Mainly Mozart Youth Orchestra as Music Director and Conductor of the Intermediate and Advanced Orchestras. Born and raised in the Philippines, Mr. Constantino was inspired to take violin lessons because of his father's love of the instrument. At nineteen, he left the Philippines for the United States, upon receiveing a full scholarship to the Philadelphia College of Performing Arts.

In 1990, Mr. Constantino won a position with the San Diego Symphony. He has lived and worked here ever since. Mr. Constantino also teaches privately at his studio, Solosoli, and is an active member of the Music Teachers Association of California. As a conductor, his credits include the Oregon Coast Music Festival, Interlochen Arts Camp and the Philippine Philharmonic Orchestra. He has held posts with such respected organizations as the Pennsylvania Ballet Orchestra, Portland Opera Orchestra, and West Coast Chamber Orchestra.

# Jane Frey Associate Music Director and Instructor Suzuki Strings/Beginning Strings



MMYO Associate Director Jane Gayle Frey grew-up in Houston, Texas where she began studying piano at age five. A second generation Ysaye student, Ms. Frey also studied viola performance with Wayne Crouse, Houston Symphony principal violist and professor of viola at Rice University's Shepherd School of Music.

Jane holds a degree in Music Theory from Baylor University where she also studied viola and piano performance. While at Baylor, Ms. Frey played in several professional orchestras in central Texas and worked as a recording studio musician for Word Records. A professional Musicians Union member since the age of 19, Jane won auditions with the Dallas Opera and Ft. Worth Symphony after college graduation. She has also performed with the Boston Pops Esplanade Orchestra, Boston Ballet, San Diego Symphony, San Diego Chamber Orchestra, Orchestra Nova and Classics for Kids.

A string pedagogy and orchestra teacher, clinician and adjudicator with over 40 years of experience, Ms. Frey has taught in workshops and institutes across the U S. Prior to her current position at MMYO, Jane was Professor of Viola and Master Teacher of the String Project at Point Loma Nazarene University.

An accomplished jazz performer, Concert Band instructor Frank Glasson received a Grammy nomination for "Best Jazz Instrumental Solo" for his improvised solos on the recording "Jazztet" in 2006. A native of Solana Beach, he has performed locally and abroad with the San Diego Chamber Orchestra, San Diego Opera, Mitteldeuschter Rundfunk Orchestra of Germany, Tokyo Opera Nomori of Japan, Cape Town Symphony Orchestra, State Theater and National Chamber Orchestras of South Africa and as a soloist with the latter two.

Frank is a Yamaha performing artist and can currently be seen performing with the San Diego Symphony Orchestra, Pacific Symphony of Orange County, La Jolla Playhouse, Broadway San Diego, and Classics 4 Kids Orchestra.

# Robyn Glasson

Instructor Intermediate Strings



Intermediate Strings instructor Robyn Glasson is a professional musician, band program administrator and music educator. Born and raised in Cape Town, South Africa, Ms. Glasson started the violin at age 9 and viola at age 13. While completing her degree at Stellenbosch Conservatory, she played in professional orchestras in South Africa. In 1997 she moved to San Diego and played full time in the viola section of the San Diego Symphony.

As a music educator Ms. Glasson has maintained a large studio and currently works as assistant band director for the Solana Beach School District. Ms. Glasson also manages the Solana Beach School District Band Program.

## ATTENDANCE POLICY

Attendance at rehearsals is MANDATORY and of vital importance to the quality of the musical and artistic excellence of the ensembles. Musicians are expected to attend all rehearsals and are only allowed four (4) excused absences or (2) unexcused absences per semester. Any musician receiving more than the allotted number of absences per semester will jeopardize their standing in the organization. However, IF YOUR STUDENT IS CONTAGIOUS, PLEASE KEEP THEM AT HOME.

In the event of an unavoidable absence, an absence request must be submitted by Friday 12pm the day before rehearsal. Absence requests submitted after 12pm on the Friday before rehearsal count as a tardy (one half of an excused absence).

EMAILING YOUR INSTRUCTOR IS NOT AN ACCEPTABLE WAY TO REPORT AN ABSENCE!

#### **REPORT AN ABSENCE:**

#### If your student(s) must be absent:

- 1. Go to mmyo.mymusicstaff.com and login to your Parent or Student portal
- 2. Go to "Calendar" in the left-hand menu
- 3. Click on the rehearsal/event for which you/your student(s) will be absent
- 4. Select "Cancel Attendance" from the event pop-up
- 5. Type your reason for the absence in the "Notes" section.
- 6. When you are done, click the red "Yes" button.

Note: If you are a parent with more than one student in MMYO, you must select the name of the student who will be absent from the drop-down menu in the pop-up box. You will need to mark each absent student separately.

#### **HOW MANY ABSENCES?**

#### Students may have:


4 Excused Absences or 2 Unexcused Absences per semester

Arriving late for rehearsal or leaving early before dismissal without being excused counts as a tardy (one half of an unexcused absence).

#### **EXCUSED ABSENCES:**

- 1. Personal or family emergency
- 2. Severe illness and/or medical emergency.
- 3. Holidays or special events celebrated by organized religions
- 4. Official academic or extracurricular activity (Exams, sports games, recitals, etc.)

## **CODE OF CONDUCT**

# All members of the MMYO community are expected to:

- respect and comply with federal, state, and municipal laws
- demonstrate honesty and integrity
- respect the rights of others and treat one another with dignity and respect at all times, regardless of economic status, race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, age or ability
- show proper care and regard for MMYO property and the property of others
- demonstrate best efforts during all MMYO and MMYOaffiliated activities
- refrain from any inappropriate behavior

### Inappropriate behavior includes, but is not limited to the following:

- breaking federal, state, or municipal laws
- any behavior that discriminates based on economic status, race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, age or ability
- any violent or bullying behavior (physical, verbal, social, electronic) that intentionally hurts (physically, socially, or emotionally) another person
- making derogatory or hateful comments toward an individual or group of individuals
- threatening an individual or group of individuals
- threatening to damage or destroy property
- injuring an individual, group of individuals, or property
- using technology to intentionally abuse or bully another person
- using technology to interfere with the positive atmosphere of MMYO
- using language that is violent, profane or discriminatory
- wearing clothes that depict violence, profanity or discrimination

Any student who exhibits inappropriate behavior while at an MMYO event or activity jeopardizes their good standing and may be dismissed from MMYO.

# MMYO students are expected to act professionally during rehearsals. Rehearsal etiquette includes but is not limited to the following:

- Students must arrive at least fifteen (15) minutes prior to the rehearsal time and be in their seats, warming up and ready to play ten minutes prior to the start of rehearsal.
- Students must bring a pencil and required music to all rehearsals.
- Students are expected to write in tempo changes, articulations, and other instructions given by the conductor during each rehearsal.
- Students must adhere to the Code of Conduct at all times. Failure to do so will result in dismissal from rehearsal. Repeated offenses will result in dismissal from all MMYO ensembles.

#### **Break Times/Snacks**

- Snacks may be eaten during break times, outside of the rehearsal room. Snacks must be cleaned up and disposed of promptly.
- Please be conscious of our students and families that may have food allergies such as peanuts, tree nuts, etc.
- During break times, students must remain in the patio area near the CT-C100 building where rehearsals are held, and may not wander around the campus or down the ramp to the parking lot.
- Students should visit the restrooms before rehearsal and during announced break times.

#### **Cell Phone Policy**

- MMYO has a Zero Tolerance cell phone policy. Students must turn OFF their cell phones (NOT TO VIBRATE ONLY) prior to rehearsals.
- Students may use their cell phones outside during breaks only. Violation of this policy will jeopardize a student's standing within his or her ensemble.

### REHEARSAL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Many of our rehearsals and events take place in areas that are easily accessible to the public. Although MMYO Staff and Instructors will be present on site to provide student supervision, parents/guardians are ultimately responsible for the safety and wellbeing of their students.

# More detailed parking, drop-off, and pick-up instructions will be provided in the fall.

#### Parking at Mesa College

- Free parking is available on weekends in Lot 8, 9, and 10. You may park in spaces marked "Staff."
- Please do not park in spots that are specially designated (i.e. "Mesa President" or Disabled).
- Parking details for other rehearsal venues will be sent in the Weekly Newsletter when applicable.

#### **Drop-Off at Mesa College**

- If you drop off your students at MMYO rehearsals, note that it is at your own risk. MMYO is unable to monitor the comings and goings of each of our 200+ students.
- Parents/Guardians are welcome to stay and observe rehearsals; please keep in mind that space is limited in the rehearsal rooms, and there may not be enough seating for all in attendance.
- Drop-off instructions for other rehearsal venues will be sent in the Weekly Newsletter when applicable.

#### Pick-Up at Mesa College

- For safety reasons, students must wait at the top of the ramp for parents/guardians until pick up. Students may not wait at the bottom of the ramp, or in the parking lot.
- Please make sure to pick up your student in a timely manner.
- Pick-up instructions for other rehearsal venues will be sent in the Weekly Newsletter when applicable.

#### **Closing Rehearsals**

- Parents/Guardians and students are asked to help line up chairs at the end of rehearsals as needed.
- Please keep in mind that we are always guests of our rehearsal space and concert venues, and ensure that your student acts accordingly. Some of the venues where we rehearse and perform are generously provided to us free of charge, and we want to maintain positive relationships with all locations.

### **CONCERTS AND DRESS REHEARSAL**

#### **Mandatory Dress Rehearsals and Concert Participation**

Musicians who fail to attend a dress rehearsal will not be allowed to perform in the concert unless excused. Without advanced authorization by the Music Director or severe emergency circumstances, missing a concert will jeopardize a student's standing within their ensemble.

Dress rehearsals take place on the day of the performance. Specific dress rehearsal times and information can be found in the MMYO Season Calendar and the Weekly Newsletter. Call times are typically 20 minutes before the beginning of the ensemble's dress rehearsal, but are subject to change without notice.

# ALL MMYO ENSEMBLES CONCERT DRESS

The following concert dress code is strictly enforced. Students will not be allowed to perform if their attire does not meet the requirements listed below.

- Formal black shirt with 3/4 or fulllength sleeve. No spaghetti straps, halter tops, or tube tops.
- Full-length formal black pants OR skirt or dress. No jeans.
- If you choose to wear a skirt or dress, the hemline must be knee-length or longer, and solid black tights must be worn underneath.
- Solid black tights or socks
- Closed-toed formal black shoes
- No sparkly or colorful accessories or jewelry

#### PHOTOGRAPHY AND RECORDING

Please be conscious of copyright, privacy, and royalty issues when taking photos are video. In some cases, MMYO may prohibit the taking of photos or videos at MMYO events.

#### **CONCERT TICKETS**

Friends and family are encouraged to attend MMYO concerts and events. While MMYO offers a number of free outreach events, some concerts will require ticket purchase. Please refer to the Weekly Newsletter emails for the most current information regarding tickets and prices.

# ADVANCED ORCHESTRA CONCERT DRESS

The following concert dress code is strictly enforced. Students will not be allowed to perform if their attire does not meet the requirements listed below.

- Formal 3/4 sleeve or full-length white button-down shirt with collar
- Formal black blazer/jacket
- Full-length formal black pants OR skirt. No jeans.
- If you choose to wear a skirt, the hemline must be knee-length or longer, and solid black tights must be worn underneath.
- Solid black tights or socks
- Closed-toed formal black shoes
- Tie (provided by MMYO)
- No sparkly or colorful accessories or jewelry

If an issue or emergency should arise the day of an MMYO event, whether it is a regular Saturday rehearsal or concert, do NOT directly contact the venue's staff or faculty.

Your first point of contact should ALWAYS be MMYO staff.

### **Weekly Newsletter**

Each Thursday, all MMYO families will receive a newsletter via email with details regarding:

- Upcoming Saturday rehearsal schedule
- MMYO news and reminders
- Information about upcoming concerts and events
- Any other important information which needs to be communicated

The newsletter will be sent to all email addresses provided in the online registration form. The newsletter will also be posted to the Parent/Student Portal.

MMYO instructors will occasionally send emails to their individual ensembles as well.

To ensure that you receive all important MMYO news and information, we ask that you keep the Parent/Student Portal AND MMYO Manager up-to-date with any changes in your email address, phone number, and/or home address.

It is YOUR responsibility to read all MMYO-related emails carefully and THOROUGHLY.

## **Volunteer Requirement**

Parents/Guardians of students are members of the Mainly Mozart Youth Orchestra family. Because tuition does not cover all rehearsal and performance expenses, MMYO relies on the support of its parents as volunteers. We require that each family commit to volunteer for 5 hours during the season or select the "buy out" option by contributing \$75 (not deducted from tuition). Families who do not complete the volunteer requirement by the end of the season will be invoiced for \$75. Parent Volunteer opportunities include the following:

Snack Table Monitor: supervise the MMYO snack table at weekly Saturday rehearsals and maintain cash box

Ensemble Chaperones: supervise MMYO ensembles backstage and during MMYO dress rehearsals, concerts and events

Stage Crew: aid Mainly Mozart staff in stage movements before, after, and during MMYO concerts and events

Ushers and ticket takers: assist Mainly Mozart staff in showing audience to their seats, distributing programs, and taking ticket stubs


